Biography

Ross and Gloria Kinsler are best known for their work in the Theological Education by Extension movement, which began in Guatemala and rapidly spread through Latin America in the 1950s-1960s. Ross grew up in Seattle, WA and Gloria grew up in North and South Korea. They met at Princeton Seminary. Following graduate study in Edinburg, Scotland, the couple was assigned by the Presbyterian Church USA to Mission work in Central America. The couple began with Spanish language study in Costa Rica, then theological education in Guatemala and later in Costa Rica. During that time, Ross and Gloria were exposed to the social upheaval and oppression being experienced in countries such as Guatemala, El Salvador, and Honduras.

In Ross Kinsler's words: "Our vision of the world and of the Gospel was shaped by the witness of the oppressed peoples we came to know and love. Hundreds of thousands of Central American men, women, and children have been tortured and massacred, especially among the indigenous Maya of Guatemala.

We understand that our faith calls us to a Theology of Liberation and a Liberation of Theology. This is an essential reading of Central America and much of our world even today. This has become our calling in memory of so many whose lives have been sacrificed."

During that time, the Kinslers found themselves contributing to the creation of the Theological Education by Extension movement. Their work included classes with peasant farmers in the highlands of Guatemala; workshops among theological educators and students in Bolivia, Argentina and Venezuela; conversations with indigenous pastors in Peru, Ecuador, and Panama; intensive courses on the biblical Jubilee in Brazil, Colombia, and Mexico; and consultations on the renewal of theological education and ministry around the world.

As of 2018, the Kinslers live in Southern California. They have lived and worked together in Scotland, Guatemala (1964-1977), Geneva (1977-1983), New Jersey, and California (1983-1987 and 2000-2018), and Costa Rica (1987-2000).

Dedication Note by Ross Kinsler:

"Under these notes lies an enormous debt of gratitude for those who have accompanied us throughout this journey, whom have shared their vision and their gifts, who continue to show us the way into God's justice, peace, and integrity of creation. Most important has been Gloria's partnership in all the above and especially her leadership in the Sanctuary Movement, bringing us the voices of victims of empire in the face of that empire. Likewise for years she has guided US church delegations through the maize of terror and obfuscation in Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, Costa Rica and Nicaragua and in this country," F. Ross Kinsler.

Scope and Content

The F. Ross Kinsler Theological Education by Extension Collection, 1964-2013 consists of correspondence, educational pamphlets, seminar records, reports, memos, and ephemera related to the Theological Education by Extension movement. Records are directly related to the program and curricular development in areas such as Southern California, Guatemala, Geneva and Costa Rica. Archival materials are in English and Spanish languages.

The F. Ross Kinsler Theological Education by Extension Collection is arranged to follow the chronological lives of Ross and Gloria Kinsler.
