Scope and Contents

Mullins (1860-1928) served as Professor of Theology and then President at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. This massive collection of 2044 microfiche preserves his papers. A theological moderate, author of *Axioms of Religion* (1908), *Baptist Beliefs* (1912) and *The Christian Religion in its Doctrinal Expression* (1917) he led the Southern Baptists to adopt their first confessional statement (1925) and in their rejection of Darwin's evolutionary theory, but insisted that the Bible was authoritative in "religious opinions" only.
